variety of personal growth skills.

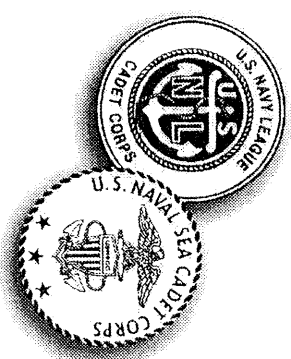
To broaden the cadets understanding of military
